## Nurse's Notes

Dear Parent:

As your school nurse, I am writing to inform you about the dangers of meningococcal disease, commonly known as meningitis, a potentially fatal bacterial infection that can strike teenagers and college students. The disease can come on quickly and may cause death or permanent disability within hours of the first symptoms, although rare the disease may be prevented through vaccination.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) now recommends routine meningococcal disease immunization at the preadolescent doctor's visit (11 to 12 years old). For those teenagers who have not been previously vaccinated, immunization also is recommended at high school

entry and for all incoming college freshmen who will live in a dormitory (only one shot required).

Teenagers and college students have an increased rate of meningococcal infection compared to the general population, accounting for nearly 30 percent of all U.S. cases annually. Of those who survive, up to 20 percent suffer long-term disabilities, including brain damage, loss of hearing, organ failure and limb amputations.

Meningococcal disease can be misdiagnosed as something less serious, because early symptoms are similar to those of influenza or other common viral illnesses, including high fever, headache, nausea and stiff neck. That is why immunization is so important. A conjugate meningococcal

vaccine is now available that public health officials anticipate will provide longer protection against four of the five strains of bacteria that cause meningococcal disease. Although teenagers and college students are at increased risk for contracting the disease, up to 83 percent of cases in this population may be prevented through immunization.

As your child's school nurse, I encourage you to speak to your child's physician about meningococcal disease and to consider immunization. We will be selling magazine and gifts in September so I encourage anyone who currently subscribes to a

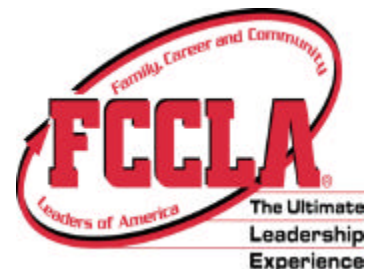
magazine to renew their subscription with FCCLA and support our students.

## Athletics

Fall sports will begin soon. High school volleyball, football, and cross country practices will **officially begin Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup>**.

Remember that all athletes must have a parent permission slip signed and a physical completed before they can participate. Parents are also encouraged to check their health insurance policies to determine if their policy covers interscholastic athletics. A very reasonable insurance policy is available through the school for those who need insurance.

Junior high sports will begin after school starts. Junior high practices will be held after school. Junior high athletes also need a physical and a signed permission slip before participating.

## Physicals

**All Kindergarten, Seventh grade students, and students who transfer from another state must have a physical exam**

**done before school begins.** Athletic participant must also have a physical before participating in the sport.

## Give your body a good start with food. . .

**Did you know that we are nearly the only school in Nebraska that offers 5 meal choices to our students each day??**

Where else can you get your choice of the Main Entrée (A.K.A. Regular, usually a hot dish) or an Alternative Main Entrée (A.K.A. Alternative, again usually a hot dish) or a Chef Salad with meat and cheese or a Yogurt Entree or a Cold sandwich with the tray! Or any combination of these items!

All you need to do is order what you wish to eat in the morning during lunch count. Beware though.... If you order it, you must eat it or pay for it anyway. We do make an exception if you go home sick. So just let us know. Grades 5 through 12 get these 5 great choices.

If you are in 2nd Grade through 4th Grade you still get to choose from 3 great meals -- Main Entrée (A.K.A. Regular) or

salad or cold sandwich with the tray.

The Hemingford School District will continue to provide great start breakfasts and hot nutritious lunches to students through the National School Lunch Program. The school district requires meals to be paid for in advance. Breakfast prices for meals are \$1.00 for grades K-12, and \$1.25 for adults. Lunch prices for meals are \$1.40 for grades K-6, \$1.70 for grades 7-12, \$2.50 for adults and \$.20 for afternoon milk. Parents are always welcome to enjoy our hot lunch program with their students, but advance notice is always needed so that enough food is prepared.

Applications for free and reduced price meals will be sent home with students on the first day of school. **You must file for free or reduced meals each year. Students who were on free and reduced lunches last year have until September**

**15<sup>th</sup> to reapply and can still receive free or reduced meals until September 15<sup>th</sup>.** New applications should be returned as soon as possible as the free or reduced meals begin the day you submit it. But applications may be submitted anytime during the school year if your income changes.

**Parents will have until September 15<sup>th</sup>** to put money into their family account. If you wish to have your children in separate accounts, you must inform Alta or Kerri before school begins. Parents may establish accounts before school begins by contacting Alta Wright or Kerri Schneider in the Administration office.

**As always our policy is no charging.** We always try to assist the students where possible, but we must have parent's cooperation also. We expect you to have a positive balance in your account before participating in the Hot Lunch program.

# Immunizations

Students entering school for the first time (K or 1st Grade) or students entering 7th Grade or transfer students from outside the State of Nebraska, regardless of grade (includes any foreign students) are required to have the following immunizations:

- 3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4th birthday,
- 3 doses of Polio vaccine,
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,
- 3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age. (For the 2005-2006 school year this includes students in

all grades and all out of state transfer students)

- 1 dose of varicella (chickenpox) if given on or after 12 months of age and prior to 13 years of age. If given at over 13 years of age, 2 doses of varicella, separated by at least one month. (For the 2005-2006 school year this includes students in grades kindergarten, 1st, 7th, and 8th, plus all out of state transfer students). Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.

All students not listed above in grades 1 through 6 and 8 through 12 are required to have the following immunizations:

- 3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on

or after the 4th birthday,

- 3 doses of polio vaccine
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,
- 3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age
- Varicella is not required in 2005-2006 (Varicella is required for kindergartners, 1st, 7th, & 8th graders for the 2005-2006 school year)

*Hemingford Schools hosts a free immunization clinic in the fall and spring for those students needing immunizations. Nurse Judy will be contacting you about your students!*

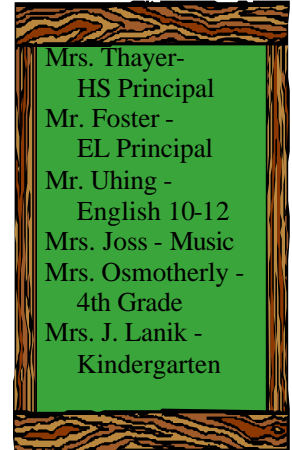

## Student Fees

The Board of Education adopted a student fee policy and reviewed it during the regular July board meeting. It defines what fees, materials, special clothing and equipment students may be required to furnish or supply to participate in extra-curricular activities. It also covers non-specialized equipment or clothing that

may be required of those students in certain curricular classes. Students who meet the income guidelines of the Federal Hot Lunch Program for free and reduced price meals may be eligible for a waiver of those fees, equipment or clothing. If your family meets the guidelines of the school lunch program, and the

parent is interested in obtaining a waiver for specialized equipment for sports or activities, please contact the Office of the Superintendent for an application. The complete policy with waiver applications is published in the student handbooks.

If you qualify for free or reduced meals, you also qualify for some student fees to be waived.
