Notes from Mr. Ningen, Superintendent of Schools "Opportunities Await Us"

"Are we ready for school to start?" That is a question that gets asked a lot this time of year. Perhaps it's because summer seems to pass so quickly. It is one that students may not want to think about yet, but many parents and all faculty members are already gearing up for the fall semester, <u>contemplating the opportunities that await our</u> children as they return to classes August 14th.

This theme may seem to be one you've heard me speak and write about before, but it's always worth repeating. No single month is as important as the first one in any school year. During that first month, good study habits, good eating and sleeping patterns, and good attitudes help to make the rest of the year a success, or a game of catch up if we don't get off to a solid start.

All of us can relate to that feeling we have when a job or an assignment is completed early and done well. As parents, students, and educators, we need to remember to treat each other with respect so that we can receive respect back.

Immunizations

Students entering school for the first time (K or 1st Grade) or students entering 7th Grade or transfer students from outside the State of Nebraska, regardless of grade (includes any foreign students) are required to have the following immunizations:

- 3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Id vaccine, one given on or after the 4~ birthday,
- 3 doses of Polio vaccine,
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,
- 3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age.
- 1 dose of varicella (chicken-pox) if given on or after 12 months of age and prior to 13 years of age. If given at over 13 years of age,
- 2 doses of varicella, separated by at least one month. Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.

(For the 2008-2009 school year this includes students in grades kindergarten, 1st, 2nd 7th, 8th and 9th plus all out of state transfer students).

All students not listed above in grades 1 through 6 and 8 through 12 are required to have the following immunizations:

- 3 doses of DTaP, DIP, DI, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4th birthday,
- 3 doses of polio vaccine
- 2 doses of FVIMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,
- **3 doses** of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age. Varicella is not required.

(Varicella is required for kindergartners, 1st, 2nd, 7th, 8th & 9th graders for the 2008-2009 school year).




