New Faces

Our Social Science department has been completely revamped. We now have Mr. Dave Chatelain and Ms. Cortney White filling the positions. They have been working diligently this summer to prepare our social science curriculum to meet the Nebraska standards that will be required shortly. Mr. Chatelain and wife, Kathi, are moving from Hyannis where he taught last year. Ms. White has been busy tending to the Box Butte County fair, after receiving her degree recently. They will be sharing the load in our Social Science department. Mr. Chatelain will also take on the responsibility of head girls basketball coach.

The new mother who is joining our staff is Mrs. Ann Chesley. She will head up the Music department and has already started with her students, learning about 8 to 5 marching as they prepare for the Box Butte County Fair parade.

Our English department will also see a new face, Patrick Robinson, who will be teaching the 10th through 12th grade English. Joining us from eastern Nebraska, Mr. Robinson will start early also as he will assist the football program. We hope you will help us make them feel at home with some hometown hospitality.

School Lunch Program

Breakfast is served at 7:45 AM each morning, with hot meals being served 3 times a week. Breakfast is a great way to get the mind ready for learning. Both breakfasts and lunches qualify for free and reduced price meals. Grades 5 through 12 get 5 choices for lunches, a Main Entrée meal, or Alternative meal, or Chef salad meal, or yogurt tray or cold sandwich. If you are in 2nd Grade through 4th Grade you still get to choose from 3 great meals -- Main Entrée or salad or cold sandwich with the tray. Parents can join their students for lunch, but please call the school and inform them so that enough food can be prepared.

The Hemingford School District will continue to provide great start breakfasts and hot nutritious lunches to students through the National

School Lunch Program. The school district requires meals to be paid for in advance. **Breakfasts prices for meals are \$1.00 for grades K-12, and \$1.25 for adults. Lunch prices for meals are \$1.40 for grades K-6, \$1.70 for grades 7-12, \$2.50 for adults and \$.20 for afternoon milk.** Parents are always welcome to enjoy our hot lunch program with their students, but advance notice is always needed so that enough food is prepared.

Applications for free and reduced price meals will be sent home with students on the first day of school. **You must file for free or reduced meals each year. Students who were on free and reduced lunches last year have until September 15th to reapply and can still receive free or reduced meals until Sep-**

tember 15th. New applications should be returned as soon as possible as the free or reduced meals begin the day you submit it. However applications may be submitted anytime during the school year if your income changes.

Parents will have until September 15th to put money into their family account. If you wish to have your children in separate accounts, you must inform Alta before school begins. Parents may establish accounts before school begins by contacting Alta Wright in the Administration office.

As always our policy is no charging. We always try to assist the students where possible, but we must have parent's cooperation also. We expect you to have a positive balance in your account before participating in the Hot Lunch program.

For safety reasons, please do not use the area to the rear of the gymnasium to load or unload your children. Use the loading zone in front of the Elementary School.

Activity passes for all regular home games will be available at the Superintendent's Office. Prices will be: Adults - \$30.00, Students Not In Activity - \$20.00, Students In Activity—\$10.00, Family - \$85.00, and Single Parent Family - \$60.00. (This pass is intended for those parents who are in a single parent family situation.)

Varsity Contests:

\$3.00 for adults, and \$3.00 for students.

Junior Varsity and Junior High Contests:

\$2.00 for adults, and \$1.00 for students.

Invitational Tournaments:

\$5.00 for adults, and \$3.00 for students.

Physicals

All Kindergarten, Seventh grade students, and students who transfer from another state must have a physical exam done before school begins. Athletic participants must also have a physical before participating in the sport. In addition, all Kindergarten students must have an eye exam. Forms for the physical and eye exams are available in the school offices. Please contact us with any questions about physicals or immunizations.

Immunizations

Students entering school for the first time (K or 1st Grade) or students entering 7th Grade or transfer students from outside the State of Nebraska, regardless of grade (includes any foreign students) are required to have the following immunizations:

3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4th birthday,

3 doses of Polio vaccine, **2 doses** of MMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,

3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or **2 doses** of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age.

1 dose of varicella (chicken-pox) if given on or after 12 months of age and prior to 13 years of age. If given at over 13 years of age, 2 doses of varicella, separated by at least one month. Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from

parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.

(For the 2006-2007 school year this includes students in grades kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 7th, 8th, and 9th, plus all out of state transfer students).

All students not listed above in grades 1 through 6 and 8 through 12 are required to have the following immunizations:

3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4th birthday,

3 doses of polio vaccine

2 doses of MMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,

3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age.

Varicella is not required.

(Varicella is required for kindergartners, 1st, 2nd, 7th, 8th, & 9th graders for the 2006-2007 school year)

Child Find

Public laws 94-142 and Rules 51 and 54 mandate a free appropriate public education is available for each handicapped child ages 0-21. Handicapped children are defined as handicapped physically, visually, speech, orthopedically, mentally, specific learning disabled, behaviorally, multi-handicapped, home or hospital bound, and whose handicap requires special services

or education. If you know of any child who meets any of these criteria and is not presently being served, please notify the Hemingford Public Schools.



Asbestos Notification

The Hemingford Public Schools are on schedule in complying with AHERA (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act). All school buildings have been inspected by certified inspectors for asbestos containing materials. Some asbestos containing materials were identified in the High School tiled floor. However the

material was found to be well covered and in good condition. The elementary building and central office building are free of asbestos.

A Management Plan has been developed and submitted to the Nebraska Department of Health. It outlines in detail the methods to be used to maintain the materials in a

Student Fees

The Board of Education adopted a student fee policy and will reviewed it during the regular August board meeting. It defines what fees, materials, special clothing and equipment students may be required to furnish or supply to participate in extra-curricular activities. It also covers

non-specialized equipment or clothing that may be required of those students in certain curricular classes. Students who meet the income guidelines of the Federal Hot Lunch Program for free and reduced price meals may be eligible for a waiver of those fees, equipment or clothing. If

your family meets the guidelines of the school lunch program, and the parent is interested in obtaining a waiver for specialized equipment for sports or activities, please contact the Office of the Superintendent for an application. The complete policy with waiver applications is published in the student

Staff Qualification Notice

The No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) of 2001 gives parents the right to get information about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teachers. Upon request, Hemingford Schools will provide the following information about their child's classroom teacher:

1. Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher

provides instruction.
2. Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency or provisional teaching certificate.
3. The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher. You may also get information about other graduate certification or degrees held by the teacher and the field of discipline of the certification degree.

We will also, upon request, tell parents whether their child is being provided services by

a paraeducator and, if so, the qualifications of the paraeducator. The request for information should be made to an administrator in your child's school building. The information will be provided to you in a timely manner. Finally, Hemingford Public Schools will give timely notice to you if your child has been assigned, or has been taught for 4 or more consecutive weeks, by a teacher who does not meet the requirements of the Act.

Leaving the Building

A concern that was brought forth is the number of times; students want to run home and pick up an item that they have forgotten or grab a uniform. This year please help me in this effort—your son or daughter may be calling you for permission to leave the building. Without the permission chances are they will not leave. I appreciate your support in this change.

Tuning Up to March



Band under the guidance of Mrs. Ann Chesley is beginning to practice. This year, band is being moved to the last period of the day. Some of the reasons behind this change is that it is warmer in the afternoon to practice marching. If needed, students can spend an additional 10 minutes on the field after school then go to other activity practices. Bus students will be excused at the normal time. An additional reason is students can set up for concerts and sports events at the end of the day, thus leaving the gym available for the day time activities and finally the number of classes interrupted for sports activities is minimized.
