Notes from Mr. Ningen, August 2007

There are some new faces at school this year in Hemingford, on the faculty, and in our classes. Just this morning, our kindergarten enrollment had risen to 31 new faces, as two new families came to register.

It is heartening to see the new families calling the panhandle home, or making the decision to send their children to our school. We continue to thrive because of the sacrifices made by patrons, the trust put forth by parents, the efforts by staff members to grow each year, and the positive attitudes from all of our students. Be sure and make all of our new students feel welcome here! We really are blessed with a good school.

On the faculty, there will be a few new faces as well, with three changes in the high school, and one in the elementary.

Mrs. Densise Watson will be our school's new Title One teacher. She lives in Alliance, and has taught most recently for the Scottsbluff Public Schools. Two new teachers will be coming to us from the Alliance Public Schools, with Mr.

Randy Hiemstra serving here as a Physical Education Instructor and as our Activities Director. He is a long-time coach, and also has served as an assistant principal. Teaching English and sponsoring National Honor Society will be Mrs.

Cathy Fingar, who also taught at HHS a few years back. Mrs. Fingar will also co-chair our school improvement committee. There will also be a new social studies instructor that will be hired this month in the high school.

There will be 15 students in pre-school this year, as our school makes a transitional move to having separate morning and afternoon sections in 2008-2009. There are 31 kindergarteners, which is a wonderful number, as well as 17 new elementary students in grades 1-6. In our Junior-Senior High School, there will be 12 new students as well. There always seems to be a number of families that leave each year as well, so the incoming numbers need to be tempered with those of friends and families that are leaving us, but overall, it looks like our school enrollment will increase for the second straight year, after several years of declining enrollment.

I want to remind parents to stay in touch with our faculty,



and I want our faculty to remember to stay in touch with

our parents.

Immunizations

Students entering school for the first time (K or 1st Grade) or students enter- ing 7th Grade or transfer students from outside the State of Nebraska, regard-less of grade (includes any foreign students) are required to have the following immunizations:

- 3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4th birthday,
- 3 doses of Polio vaccine,
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,
- 3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age.
- **1 dose** of varicella (chicken-pox) if given on or after 12 months of age and prior to 13 years of age. If given at over 13 years of age, 2 doses of varicella, separated by at least one month. Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.

(For the 2007-2008 school year this includes students in grades kindergarten, 1 st, 2 nd, 7 th, 8 th, and 9 th, plus all out of state transfer students).

All students not listed above in grades 1 through 6 and 8 through 12 are required to have the following immunizations:

- 3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4th birthday,
- 3 doses of polio vaccine
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,
- 3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age. Varicella is not required.

(Varicella is required for kindergartners, 1st, 2nd, 7th, 8th, & 9th graders for the 2006-2007 school year)

School Lunch Program

Breakfast is served at 7:45 AM each morning, with hot meals being served 3 times a week. Breakfast is a great way to get the mind ready for learning. Both breakfasts and lunches qualify for free and reduced price meals. Grades 5 through 12 get 5 choices for lunches, a Main Entrée meal, Alternative meal, Salad Bar, Yogurt tray or cold sandwich. If you are in 2nd Grade through 4th Grade you still get to choose from 3 great meals -- Main Entrée, salad or cold sandwich with the tray. Parents can join their students for lunch, but please call the school and inform them so that enough food can be prepared.

The Hemingford School District will continue to provide great start breakfasts and hot nutritious lunches to students through the National School Lunch Program. The school district requires meals to be paid for in advance. Breakfasts prices for meals are \$1.05 for grades K-12, and \$1.30 for adults. Lunch prices for meals are \$1.45 for grades K-6, \$1.75 for grades 7-12, \$2.55 for adults and \$.25 for afternoon milk.

Applications for free and reduced price meals will be sent home with students on the first day of school. You must file for free or reduced meals each year. Students who were on free and reduced lunches last year have until September 15th to reapply and can still receive free or reduced meals until September 15th. New applications should be returned as soon as possible as the free or reduced meals begin the day you submit it. However applications may be submitted anytime during the school year if your income changes.

Parents will have until September 15th to put money into their family account. If you wish to have your children in separate accounts, you must inform Sandy before school begins. Parents may establish accounts before school begins by contacting Sandy Haas in the Administration office.

As always our policy is no charging. We always try to assist the students where possible, but we must have parent's cooperation also. We expect you to have a positive balance in your account before participating in the Hot Lunch program.
