### FRONT DOOR ENTRY

#### TESTING

We will administer the fall MAPS tests in September this year to students in Kindergarten -11<sup>th</sup> grade. The tentative dates are September 15-19 and September 22-26. Please help by making sure your child/children are in school and have had a good night's sleep. We appreciate the support and encouragement you give your child each day to do their best in school.



#### WAYS TO IMPROVE YOUR CHILD'S MATH SKILLS

very important that younger children gain a firm grasp of basic math concepts, so algebra and geometry become part of a natural succession rather than an uphill struggle. There practical things every parent can do to greatly improve their child's math skills and conceptual understanding.

- 1. Play cards and board games with your child. Simple games such as Go Fish and Crazy 8's are a great way for young children to learn the value of numbers.
- 2. Count change with your child and have him or her use money in real-life situations. Use nickels and dimes to have children count by increments of 5 and 10. For older children, have them play "cashier" and count back change to you after you "purchase" an item.
- 3. **Play number guessing games.** Here is an example: I am thinking of a number between 1 and 100. It is more than 50. It is an even number. It is the product of 8 times 9.
- 4. **Fill a jar with jellybeans and have your child estimate how many there are.** After their initial estimate, take out 10 and allow them to amend their guess. When you count the actual number, show your child how to count in increments of two.

**Use dice to do mental addition and teach probability.** Ask your child, "Am I more likely to roll a 7 or a 12?" For a challenge, use more than two dice. You can list all of the possible combinations on a piece of paper.



As you try these math activities with your child, remember to be positive, patient and encouraging. You want your child to understand that math is both fun and useful.

### Thayer's Thoughts

Who would have thought that rain would have greeted us the first two days of school? It put a slight damper on our outside welcome back activities; however, the kids were great and enjoyed the time. I believe that the 7th grade has settled into their routine and the seniors are beginning to make graduation decisions regarding colors, flowers, etc. Now that school is rolling, and activities are in full swing, please check out the calendar on the website for the most current information. The Booster Calendar is an asset, but a few events have changed since the calendars were printed. Many items are added and deleted on a continuous basis. #### **Questions -- Answers**

- What are class dues used for? Each class votes on class dues that accumulate each year. #### K12 Planet - Student and Parent Access

One tool that all students are able to use is personal access to their grades via the internet. Teachers are required to post updated grades by Monday noon. Changes to K12 planet take affect each morning after the upload scheduled for 7:30 am.



### School Hot Lunch Program

Breakfast is served at 7:45 AM each morning, with hot meals being served 3 times a week. Breakfast is a great way to get the mind ready for learning. Both breakfasts and lunches qualify for free and reduced price meals. Grades 5 through 12 get 3 choices for lunches, a Main Entrée meal, Alternative meal, Salad Bar. If you are in 2nd Grade through 4th Grade you still get to choose the Main Entrée or salad with the tray. Parents can join their students for lunch, but please call the school and inform them so that enough food can be prepared.

The Hemingford School District will continue to provide great start breakfasts and hot nutritious lunches to students through the National School Lunch Program the school district requires meals to be paid for in advance. Breakfast prices for meals are \$1.05 for grades K-12, and \$1.30 for adults. Lunch prices for meals are \$1.45 for grades K-6, \$1.75 for grades 7-12, \$2.55 for adults and \$.25 for afternoon milk.

Applications for free and reduced price meals will be sent home with students on the first day of school. You must file for free or reduced meals each year. Students who were on free and reduced lunches last year have until September 14th to reapply and can still receive free or reduced meals un-til September 14<sup>th</sup>. New applications should be returned as soon as possible as the free or reduced meals begin the day you submit it. However applications may be submitted anytime during the school year if your income changes.

Parents will have until September 14th to put money into their family account. If you wish to have your children in separate accounts, you must inform Sandy before school begins. Parents may establish accounts before school begins by contacting Sandy Haas in the Administration office.

Attention: Remember the changes to our Hot Lunch program this year. All accounts need to have a positive balance before your child can eat the first day of school. Also, there will be no extras after \$10.00 owed and no tray will be served if your account is a negative \$20.00 or more.

### PE/Weight Training Happenings

Welcome back students and greetings to all the parents. It's exciting to get another year started, but it sure gets hectic at the beginning of the school year. We are busy conducting tests the first couple weeks of school as we seek to determine each student's fitness level coming off the summer months.

Physical Education students in the 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> grades will be tested in the mile run, 40 yard dash, 20 yard dash, shuttle run, push ups, sit ups, sit and reach, and vertical jump. Weight training classes will test out in bench and squat maxes, 80% bench max reps, mile run, 40 yard dash, 20 yard dash, sit and reach, sit ups, and vertical jump.

After we establish our baseline Fitness Index we will begin our regular curriculum for each level of class. I am pleased that we've changed our 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade PE classes from one semester sections to split classes which will meet for the full year. I believe that will lead to better retention for these students and also allow us to expand our offerings. 
