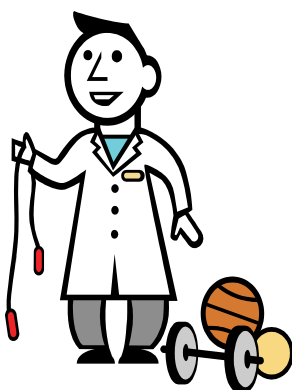

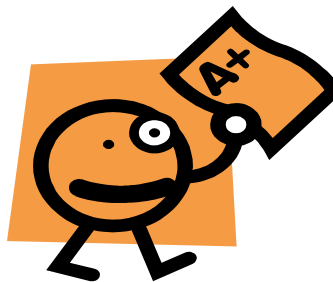

As parents, students, and educators, we need to remember to treat each other with respect so that we can receive respect back.

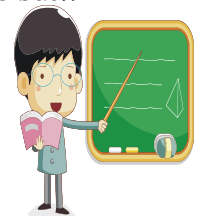
A teacher was sitting at her desk grading papers, when her first grade class came back from lunch. Alice informed the teacher, "Paul has to go to the principal's office."

New Immunization Requirements for 2010-2011 School Year for 7th grade



A new law, effective in July 2010 requires that all 7th graders have 1 dose of Tdap vaccine which must contain pertussis booster. The law requires that this shot be given after age 10 or 11 depending on which brand of vaccine is given.

All students entering 7th grade for the 2010-2011 school year must have a 7th grade physical and updated immunizations.

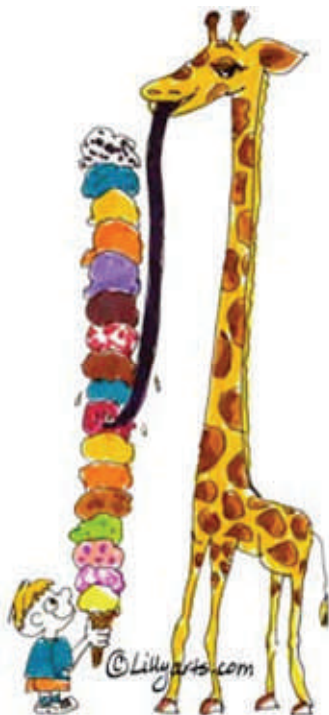
Immunizations for newborns through 18-year-olds

We would like to make the program available to any student who needs it. The purpose of summer school is to maintain the skills already known, not to introduce new material. We plan to have a light-hearted, enjoyable two weeks and hope to see your student(s) there! If your student attends all of summer school or only misses a day or two, we will be offering fair tickets as incentives! **If you have received a notice about summer school, please check whether your child will be attending or not and return it to the school so we can have an approximate count of students and are prepared with enough materials and snacks. I will send a reminder to all invited students in late June.**

Preschool-Mrs. Moudry

If your child will be 4 by October 15, 2010 s/he is eligible to attend our school pre-school. The preschool runs four days a week with lunch and snack provided. There are two half-day sessions. If you have a child you would like to attend preschool and haven't received any information about it, please call Brianne Moudry at 487-3460. Thank you!

For our school Rule 11 preschool, if students reach age four by October 15, and reside in our district, they are admitted with no stipulations. If students turn four after October 15 and before Christmas break, and are potty-trained, they can begin preschool after their birthday. If a student is at least four, moves into our district and was in a full-time preschool program previously, they may begin preschool when they move here.

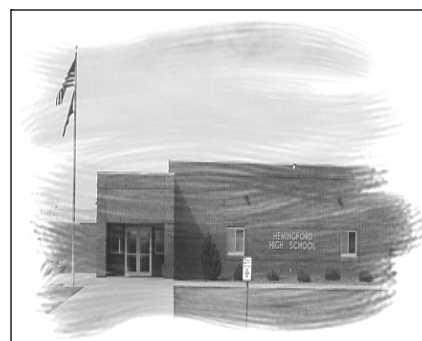
