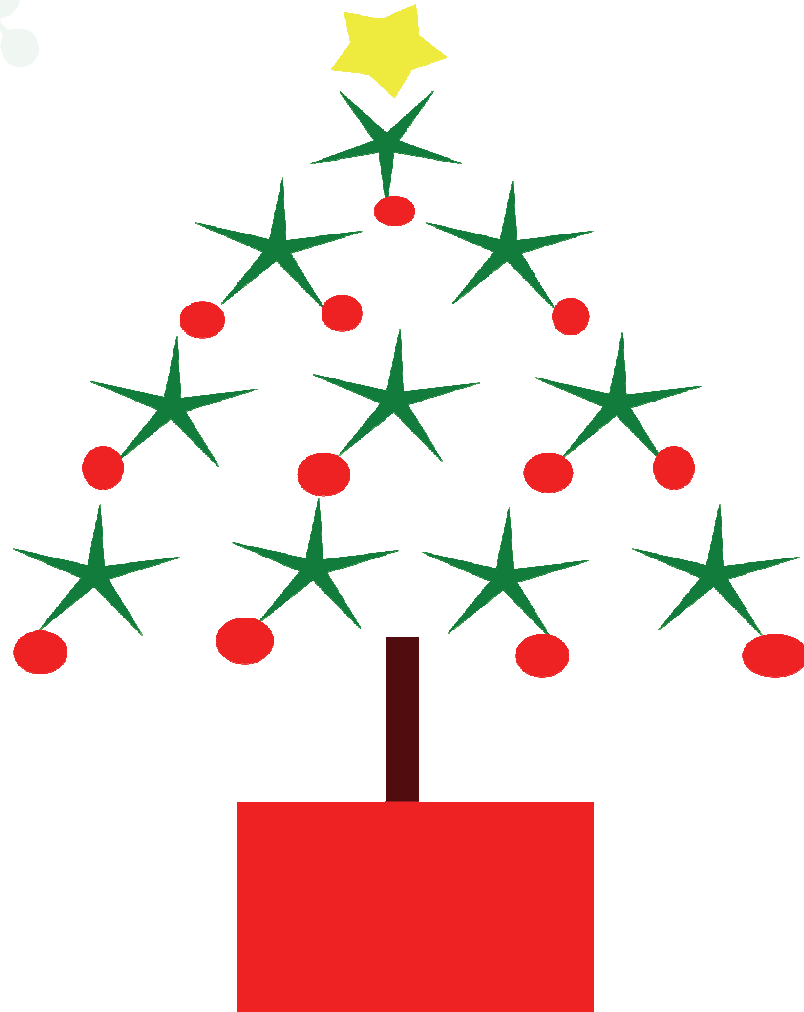

December is usually a hectic month; I know that the squares on my calendar are filling fast with a variety of activities. As we have experienced, activities are a vital part of the learning process but students and teachers will be pushing hard to get through the content that is needed by end of the semester. Please help your son or daughter maintain passing grades by checking on their grades and asking questions. (Eligibility Policy Review below) If SST after school is a concern (bus riders, jobs, etc) then a student should contact the teacher and make arrangements to come in the morning. Teachers are willing to help— however based on their lives some do not arrive before the 8:00 am contract time (day care, getting own children moving, driving, etc) unless there is a meeting for a student or helping a student.

Also please take time during the breaks to visit with your children about what is happening in their lives. Time is a great gift and it is free. I always learn something from their perspective when I chat with them. Wishing your family a safe holiday! Happy Holidays!!

Academic Information

- **End of the Semester after Christmas**

The semester ends on **January 15th**. Students will be dismissed at 1:00 pm on December 18th for the holiday break. When they return from Christmas break, students will have a week or so for final presentations, review, tests and homework completion before the end of the semester.



- **Distance Learning Classes (DL) or Schedule Changes**

Most on-line college classes or DL classes wrap up before Christmas so if a student is thinking about rearranging their schedule, they will need to stop in the office and visit with Mrs. Foster. Very few schedule changes are allowed; however students do need to pick up the add or drop form from either Mrs. Hucke or Mrs. Foster to be signed by the teacher and parent if they wish to make a schedule change. This also needs to be completed prior to Christmas break.

- **Progress Reports**

2nd Quarter update--Mailed to families on December 2nd. Student grades may be checked anytime through PowerSchool. The process to set up the parent account is different this year. Please contact the office if you would like help setting up your account. The other option is to use your son/daughter's password. The student account works the same as last year.

- **Just a Review of the Eligibility Policy**

Eligibility for Junior and Senior High students at Hemingford Public Schools is determined on a weekly (M-F) basis. Students failing the same class in any two consecutive weekly (M-F) periods will be considered ineligible for any and all activities, competitions, or performances for a seven-day period running from the following Wednesday through Tuesday. Individuals may practice with a team, however, they may not be released from school to travel with that team. Students who attend Supervised Study Time (SST) and show weekly (M-F) academic progress prior to a determination of ineligibility based reported grades may earn the status of academic probation for the ineligibility period and participate in school-sponsored activities.

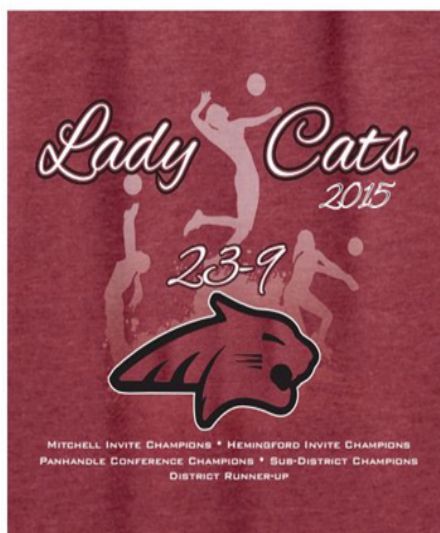

New books at HHS

Beautiful Creatures series: Ethan's life will never be the same since he met Lena—but can their feelings for each other overcome their vastly different lives? This supernatural series is a great fit for readers who like a little romance mixed in with a lot of action—if you liked Cassandra Clare's *City of...* series, give *Beautiful Creatures* a try.

Dumplin': Willowdean Dickson, self-proclaimed “fat girl,” has always been comfortable in her own skin—but now that she's dating a popular jock, she's started to doubt herself. Her solution: enter the Miss Clover City beauty pageant, and maybe change things in her town as well as for herself.

Unstoppable: Harrison's life has been anything but easy. But just as things might be turning around—he has a new foster family, and his dreams of playing in the NFL have a chance of becoming reality—he receives horrible news. Can he overcome a devastating medical diagnosis?

The Body in the Woods: Three young members of a volunteer search and rescue team get more than they bargained for when they find the body of a teenage girl while searching for a missing man.

The Jewel: Fans of *The Selection* by Kiera Cass will be intrigued by this first book in a new series. Violet, known only as #197, has been removed from a life of poverty to become a surrogate for royalty. But she finds that her new life is not luxurious—rather, she has entered a life of servitude, in which her budding romance with an unlikely suitor may prove dangerous.

The New Order: This sequel to *The Young World* finds Donna and Jefferson on separate continents, desperately trying to stop a disaster that could be even worse than the Sickness.

The Luxe: Sisters Elizabeth and Diana Holland are the darlings of 1899 Manhattan's upper class social scene, until they discover that their golden futures may be in danger, and a carriage accident could end one girl's hopes and dreams—forever.

Slow Getting Up: Former Denver Bronco Nate Jackson describes life in the NFL “at the bottom of the pile.” For players who aren't superstars, the grueling physical and emotional demands of the game can be damaging, and Jackson candidly describes his experience with a touch of humor to give readers a look inside the “real” NFL.

Bet Your Life: In this second mystery featuring Jess Tenant, Jess is just settling down to life in a small English town when a brutal attack on a young man draws her into yet another chilling mystery. But in this case, the victim is hardly innocent himself—could she be looking for a group of his victims, bent on revenge?

Hunt for Jade Dragon: In this fourth installment of the Michael Vey series, Michael and his friends travel to China to rescue a teen prodigy who might just know how he and the rest of the Electroclan gained their mysterious powers.

The Batboy: Brian has been selected as a batboy for a major baseball team. Can he somehow win back his father and help Hank Bishop, a player previously banned for steroid use?

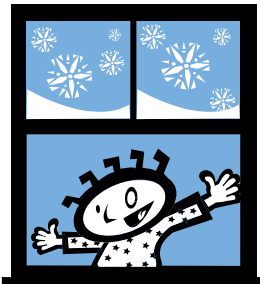

A Focus on Impaired Driving Prevention During the Holiday Season

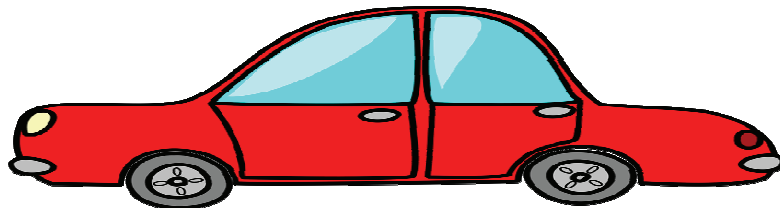
According to the National Highway of Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA) the number of drunk driving accidents increases from 36 percent to 54 percent over the holiday season! That makes this season a great time to talk about impaired driving prevention.

Not only is it illegal to drink under the age of 21, it is also more dangerous. Teens who drink and drive are less likely to wear their seat belt and more likely to crash.

There are a few things you can do to stay safe. Keep some of these simple tips in mind:

- Understand that Zero Tolerance means just that – if you are stopped with any traceable amount of alcohol in your system, it is illegal. There is no minimum BAC for underage teens.
- If you're relying on a ride from someone who has been drinking, find another ride. Everyone reacts to alcohol differently. If you know a friend has been drinking, assume they are unable to drive.
- Food, coffee or exercise will not reduce the amount of alcohol in your system. Only time decreases the effects of alcohol.
- If a friend has been drinking and is about to drive, speak up. Offer to drive, take the keys or call a parent.
- Most of those killed in alcohol-related crashes involving teen drivers are the young drivers themselves and their passengers.
