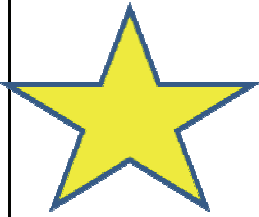

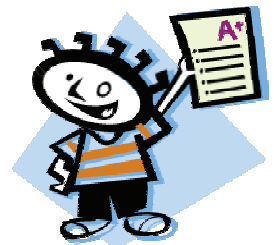


Semester Grades

The semester grade is the average of 1st and 2nd quarter which is how a student earns credit toward graduation. One of the first questions, you may ask your child is “Are you giving your best effort?” or “Was there something more you could have done to improve your grade?” If the semester grade is below 70%, no credit is issued and students will have to retake the class. Teachers are willing to help, but students need to make an effort to receive help. There is always room in SST.

Honor Roll

The honor roll includes grades 4-12 for the 2nd Quarter and 1st Semester. It will be published in the newspaper as well as the next newsletter. The Distinguished List will include the names of those students who have earned all “A’s”. The Honor List will include the names of those students who have all “A’s” and “B’s” and have earned an average of 90% and above.



NeSA-Writing for Grades 8 and 11

The writing window is from January 19 through February 6 for students to write on a specific topic with the results being scored and ranked at the state level. This test is very important in having the students give their best efforts. Students are currently taking practice tests to help build familiarity with the program used by the state for testing.

ASVAB Test—January 13

Due to the changes in the PLAN test (no longer available), Hemingford will be administering the ASVAB test for the career interest inventory as well as for those students interested in a military branch. Colt Foster posted his 1,000th point on Saturday against the Leyton Warriors in Hemingford in front of a raucous crowd. The Bobcats went on to win going away 83-58.

Colt Foster is a four year starter for the Bobcats, and is averaging 13.3 points per game, 8 rebounds a game, 1.8 assists a game, 3 steals a game, and .5 blocks a game this season. Foster posted 9 points in the win.

Foster, however, said that he does not care about personal honors, but just wants his team to win. Foster's scoring, however, has been an important asset for the Bobcat's perfect season.

Other schools in the contest included North Platte St. Pats, Cambridge, Perkins County, Sutherland, Morrill, Creek Valley, and Dundy County-Stratton.

State Champions 2014

Bobcats placed six players on the All-State Team; six on defense and two on offense. As prolific as their offense was during the year; it was the defense that led the Cats to their first state championship in Lincoln.

Ethan Skinner and Colt Foster were named All-Class Honorary Captains of D-1 Iron Man Football. Ethan Skinner and Tanner Bengue were All-State selections on offense, while Colt Foster, Matthew Wood, Matthew Davis, and Brady Turek were named All-State selections on defense.

Skinner rushed for 2685 yards on 269 carries, averaging 10 yards a carry on 47 touchdowns. Skinner also recorded two kick return touchdowns and a receiving touchdown. Foster paced the defense with 129 tackles, 34 tackles for a loss, 5.5 sacks, 2 fumble recoveries, and one blocked field goal. Matthew Wood recorded 72 tackles, 9 tackles for loss, forced 4 fumbles, obtained 5 fumble recoveries, and 4 interceptions (all of which went for touchdowns). Matthew Davis made 54 tackles, 14 tackles for loss, 1 sack, and 1 fumble recovery. Brady Turek made 59 tackles, 8 tackles for loss, forced 3 fumbles, recovered 3 fumbles, recorded a team high 7 picks.

Wood goes out as the school's all-time leading passer in all categories, and Skinner goes out as the all-team leading rusher in all categories.

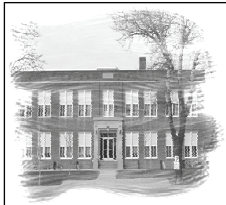
