Already—Yes! Set those clocks ahead on March 8th. Daylight-Savings time is upon us. Until everyone’s internal clock adjusts, please work with your son or daughter in getting them up and moving to be at school on time. Being on time is a skill that needs to be developed. School is the primary “job” for students and should be treated as such. The season for shorts also begins again at this time. Please help us with the length of shorts that girl’s wear. They should rest at mid-thigh is a good visual ruler for you.



NeSA State Testing —This year April is the primary month for state testing. Testing will be for students in grades 7, 8, and 11 in reading, math and science. The dates are noted on the school calendar. Due to the importance of these tests for our school, the students will have a testing schedule. Students should not schedule appointments during these times.

ACT Test Preparation---The school is using the John Baylor Test Prep material which has data that provides evidence that this program is successful in raising test scores. All juniors will go through the 10 sessions during the school day. This will be beneficial as a review for state testing as well as in preparation for those juniors that might take the ACT test in April. This is free to the students, which is an advantage for our students. Some schools charge for this prep activity.

Please help support your child and school by letting them know how important it is to give their best effort on these tests.

Parent/Teacher Conferences—End of 3rd Quarter is March 19



Please plan to spend some time at the high school on **Tuesday, March 31** for parent/teacher conferences. Conferences run from 2:00 – 8:00 pm. At that time you may pick up your son or daughters report card as well as discuss with teacher the strengths/concerns of your child. This is an excellent opportunity to discuss what projects may be upcoming or ask questions. Feel free to bring your son/daughter to conferences with you. It is useful for them to hear the good as well as how they could do better. Remember conferences are for all the students in grades 7-12.

Teacher Assessment Day

The morning of April 1, teachers will spend time with 6-trait writing scoring. Teachers will score the writing that was completed March 11. These results help provide data to the English department which they use to adjust curriculum.

Supervised Study Time (SST)

It happens from 3:30-4:00 Monday-Thursday. Looking for students that need time to make up work from being absent, use computers, finish projects, ask questions, or finish homework; all ways that can raise a student grade and understand material presented. All students are welcome to use this time. SST also helps to keep students eligible by receiving the one-to one assistance that may be needed to understand a concept or complete some unfinished work.

Absent or Truant? Thank you for making the calls as early as possible.

When it is necessary for a student to be absent for a non-school related activity, the parent or guardian is asked to call the school prior to 8:45 am. You can leave a message on the school answering machine early in the morning if that works best for you. This is to ensure safety and accountability for your child. Also if you would like an assignment sheet for your son/daughter, it needs to be requested when you call in. Normally when your child is ill enough to be at home, it may be more beneficial for them that they sleep during the day and plan on staying for SST the next day to work on missed assignments.



Also, attendance is a direct correlation for student success. Please try to schedule necessary appointments during breaks or when little time from school can be missed.

Your help in keeping students in school as long as possible is much appreciated.

School Activities

During the month of March, athletic competitions as well as fine arts and academic competitions continue. Band clinics, instrumental music, quiz bowl teams are all part of the March activities. The Dinner-Theatre is set for the weekend of March 27-29 with District Speech (March 16) and WTC Instrumental Music (March 10). Quiz Bowl competitions will be March 4 at Mitchell, March 18 at Bayard, March 20 at PHC (Hemingford Host) and March 25—WTC at Bridgeport. Finally, the CSC Scholastic Day is set for March 27.

STATE READING, MATH, and SCIENCE TESTS



We will administer the NeSA-R and NeSA – M, (Nebraska State Accountability Reading and Math) tests this **March and April** for students in grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 11. We also will administer the NeSA-S (Nebraska State Accountability Science) to grades 5, 8, and 11. This is a state requirement to measure student growth against schools throughout our state. **THESE TESTS ARE VERY IMPORTANT.**

Library News

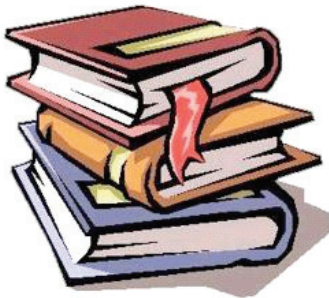

New High School/Jr. High Books:

Conversion: The girls at an exclusive private school begin exhibiting strange tics and other symptoms. Is it all in their heads, or could it be related to the school's location in the same town where the Salem Witch Trials were held?

The Company They Keep: This non-fiction book is a look at life inside the U.S. Special Forces.

Clariel: This prequel to *The Old Kingdom* series tells the story of Clariel, a young woman who has just discovered her magical powers and must now help capture a threatening magical creature while attempting to avoid an arranged marriage.



The Rivalry: This sports mystery follows two teen reporters who uncover a plot at the Army-Navy game.

The Girl from the Well: Okiku, a ghost, has spent hundreds of years avenging the deaths of children, but now she has met Turk, who is being followed by another, more menacing spirit, and their destinies seem to be intertwined.

Chosen Soldier: This non-fiction book follows a group of soldiers through their training to become Green Berets.

Liar, Liar: Kevin lies because he thinks it can be helpful, but now all of his lies are catching up to him. How can he set things right?

Reckoning: Everyone assumes that Silver Blackthorn is lucky when she is selected to be an Offering for the new English king, but when she discovers that this is not the case, she must find a way to escape.

We Were Liars: Cadence and her cousins always spent their summers in a world of privilege, on a private island owned by their grandfather, until Cadence's accident left her debilitated by headaches and unable to remember what happened to her. Now they're back, but as Cadence slowly recovers her memories, she finds that the truth can be haunting.

Fragments and Ruins: These two books complete the *Partials* sequence, telling the story of Kira and Samm as the final battle between the Partials and humans looms.

- readers will notice a number in addition to the won-loss record beside each team. That number is what the NSAA uses to "seed" brackets in sub-districts and at State.

In Nebraska the winners of the twelve sub-districts play each other (11 vs 12 in the case of the Western teams), to determine the six district winners (our girls team will be playing another sub-district winner, North Platte St. Pat's) in just such a game.

The six District winners automatically advance to the State Tourney. There are eight slots at the tourney, with the last two places filled by the two teams in each class (ours is C2), that were not district champions, and have the highest point averages of all the other teams in the state.

So this means that two teams in each Class (A, B, C1, C2, D1, and D2) make it to the State Tourney as "Wild Cards".

That point average that each team has is re-figured after every Ballgame, and is sometimes just hundredths or thousandths of points apart. It is not only based on winning or losing a game, but also on the games the team your team is playing has won or lost. Beating a team with a good record earns more points than beating a team with a bad record. Losing to a good or a bad team also earns two different point values.

When our boys lost to Bridgeport (a very good team), we earned 39 points. When our boys beat Bridgeport, we earned 50 points. Those points from every one of our games are then averaged to give us the number you see after our name above.

All that being said, the best/ most certain way to get to state is to win the sub-district and the district final.

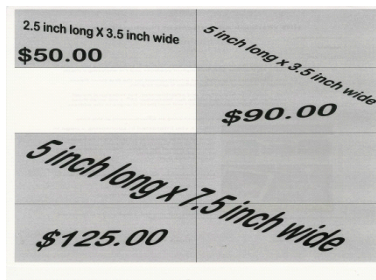
