### IS IT REALLY MAY?

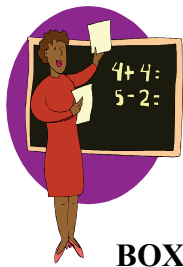

A Big Thank You for supporting our school system and our students this past year. The end of the school year is just around the corner and it seems that just last week I was helping the 7<sup>th</sup> graders locate their classrooms. ### UPSHIFT DAY FOR GRADE 6

### Student Appearance

Thanks for your help in keeping the standard for school dress code. Leggings are not considered pants. If worn, the shirt must be long enough to go past the butt. Shorts need to be proper length --the current trendy short is not necessarily the proper length and should be saved and worn on weekends or after school or could be worn over the leggings. The student handbook, page 28, states appropriate length for shorts is mid-thigh. Shirts should provide coverage of bare skin (midriffs, spaghetti straps, and cleavage) and contain appropriate messages. 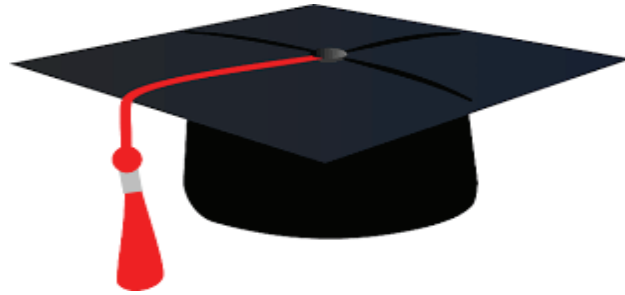

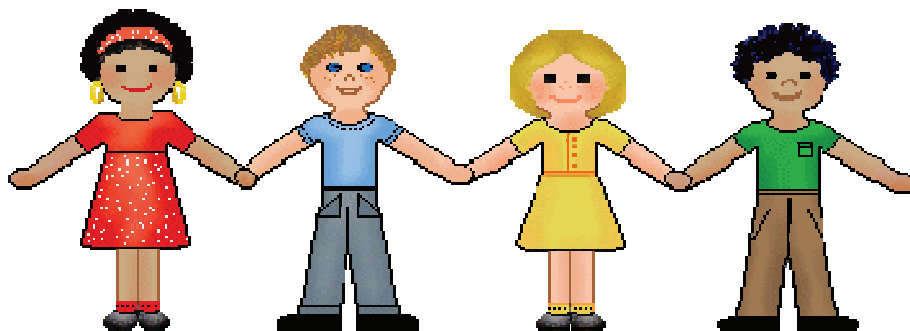

## Athletic Directors

### Athletic Directors Comments

As the academic year comes to a close, many of us find ourselves gearing up for the summer time activities. As our students go separate paths to relax, re-energize, and reflect upon what they have accomplished this school year, it is important to remember that tomorrow's success depends upon the groundwork done today. With that being said, it is very easy to get wrapped up in so much busywork, we forget to take the time to enjoy where we are at. Find your happy balance, and get the most out of life.

This year we are going to try to help parents and student schedules by hosting physicals and concussion testing during school hours. The intent is to help make sure all of our potential athletes have all their state mandated physicals and concussion testing done before they start next school year. The physicals will be done in the morning on both days between 9 am and 12 pm. **The cost for the physicals is \$25.00**, and checks need to be made out to *Hemingford Public Schools*. The concussion baseline screening will occur in the afternoon between 12 pm and 3 pm. The cost for the baseline concussion testing is covered by the school, and is required to be updated every other year. This is a great opportunity to take advantage of, and at a discounted price compared to a physical through your regular health provider. This is not required to be done at this time, but it will need to be done before they participate in activities next school year.

Dear Students and Parents:

As we approach the summer it is already time to plan ahead what we need to do to be ready for next school year and activities. One of the key pieces is the activity physical. According to NSAA Bylaw 3.4: Each student who participates in athletics must have a physical examination completed prior to participation begins.

This year we are changing our physical dates from the summer to the school year to better accommodate our students. We will have two dates for students to complete physicals, **May 11<sup>th</sup> and May 18<sup>th</sup> from 9 AM to 12 PM**. This is something new we would like to try so students do not have to make special arrangements during the summer. This is a wonderful opportunity to get a physical for the **low cost of \$25**. Students do not have to complete physicals at this time but are required to have a completed physical form turned in to the school before participation in any activity begins next year.

Due to the large number of students receiving physical exams during these times we are going to assign each grade a certain day. If these days do not work for a particular person because of prior commitments please let us know and we will work with you.

**Wednesday May 11<sup>th</sup>:** 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> Grades Physical Exam and 6<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> Grades Concussion Screen

**Wednesday May 18<sup>th</sup>:** 6<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> Grades Physical Exam and 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> Grades Concussion Screen

We will also be offering concussion baseline screening for all students from 12 PM to 3:30 PM both of these days. Hemingford Schools is progressive in screening for concussions and concussion prevention. We require all students participating in activities 7-12 to have a baseline screen. In case of concussion we have a comparative exam to test against. We are one of many schools that use the Impact online test but one of few who also uses a balance test component. The baseline test is good for two years so if a student was screened last summer they do not need to be screened this year. Box Butte General Rehab and Wellness Center will be completing these exams and has all records of whether or not the student is current. There is no cost to the student for this exam.

As always if you have any questions please do not hesitate to call. This information will also be provided in the May newsletter. Thank you for your help in making this a smooth transition. Again students are not required to have a physical exam completed at the school but are required to have a physical completed.

**Library News**

*Need a good book this summer?*

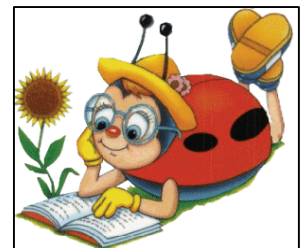
*Try Overdrive!*



Overdrive is an online service to which the school subscribes. It allows students (and parents) to “check out” e-books and audiobooks, and it’s completely free! It’s also a great way to help your kids read all summer long—there are books available for all ages, from preschool to adult! Overdrive e-books and audiobooks can be accessed via a computer, tablet, smartphone, or other devices that have internet access. You can read or listen through your browser, or you can download the book onto your device and read or listen even when you don’t have internet access. All materials are automatically “returned” on the due date, so you never have to worry about an overdue book, and you can check out up to six items at once.



Getting started is easy. Just go to [nebraska.lib.overdrive.com](http://nebraska.lib.overdrive.com), and click on “Sign In” in the upper right hand corner of the page. This will take you to a page with a drop-down list; select “Hemingford Public Schools” and click “Go.” The next page will ask for a “Library Card Number” and a “PIN.” Your student’s library card number is the same number he or she types in after getting a hot lunch at school to indicate that he or she went through the lunch line. The PIN is “muggles” and is the same for everyone. If your student does not know his/her lunch number, please contact the school and we can get that information to you. An Overdrive app is also available for smartphones and tablets (submitting login information on the app is essentially identical to the process described above).



Overdrive is a great resource that can be used by everyone in your family. Studies show that reading during the summer is a great way to help kids maintain their academic skills even when they are not in school. Overdrive has thousands of e-books and audiobooks that are just waiting to be explored—it’s like having a library inside your phone, tablet, or computer!
