From the Superintendent's Standpoint

March 2024

Over the past year our students have made much academic progress. This next month is a critical time for our students to keep learning as we move through March toward April and the opportunity for students to showcase their learning through their performance on the state tests in the various academic content areas.

Teachers have been working hard to ensure our curricular materials and student opportunities align with the state standards. Throughout this year, our staff have worked with Dr. Julie Downing from ESU#13 and the SEED team with the Nebraska Department of Education along with Mrs. Kristin Kasten and Mrs. Amy Trauernicht of ESU#13 to review the standards and prioritize those standards based on four categories: Endurance, Leverage, Readiness, and Tested. As part of this effort, our teachers have been examining each standard according to these criteria:

Endurance: Is this a skill or knowledge that has value throughout schooling and life beyond the current grade?

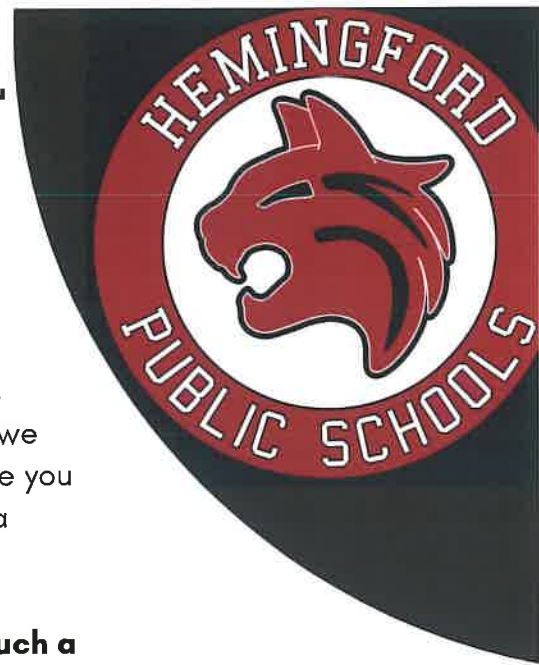
Leverage: Is this a skill or knowledge that is valuable across several academic and life subject areas?

Readiness: Is this a skill or knowledge necessary for success at the next grade level?

Tested: Is this a skill or knowledge that is tested on multiple measures or an area our staff has identified as needing improvement?

Based on this analysis, our teachers have identified “priority standards” and are working hard to ensure students learn the priority information prior to the state tests. While teachers provide instruction/coverage of all state standards, decisions about pacing and timing of the lessons are informed by this analysis to help ensure tested standards are learned prior to the state assessments in April.

While we know that our students are all much “more than a score,” we also want to maximize their opportunities to perform well on these assessments. As parents, please keep encouraging your students to work hard to keep learning all the way to the end of the year.

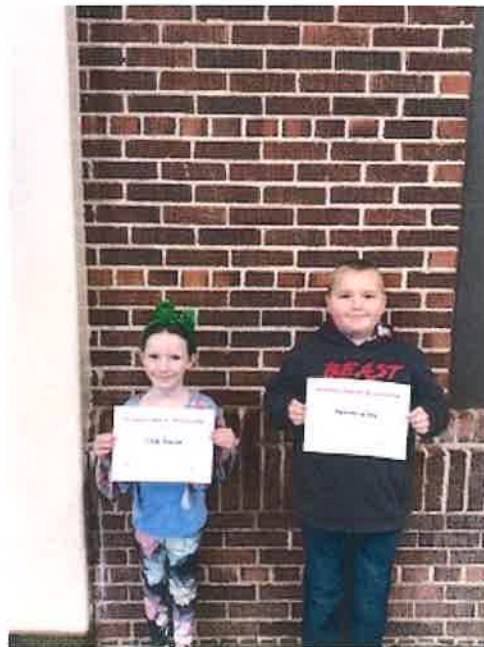

Language at Home

Communicative Temptations provide opportunities for children to communicate more frequently throughout the day. It involves structuring the environment in order to 'tempt' the child to communicate. Children are more likely to communicate when they are motivated and have a reason for doing so.

How to use Communicative Temptations:

- During activities that are easily stopped and started, stop the activity and wait for your child to communicate their desire to start the activity again. If necessary, model an appropriate phrase such as, 'Go.'
- Put a toy that your child enjoys on a high shelf or in a childproof container. Wait for your child to communicate in order to request the toy.
- During activities that include many parts such as a craft, give your child one item, then wait for your child to communicate to request the other items one at a time.

Activities

- Go on a St. Patrick's Day scavenger hunt around your neighborhood for items that are each color of the rainbow. Draw pictures of the items or make a list. Talk about where you found each item and how you use it.
- Have your child help you wash the laundry. Sort clothing into light and dark color piles. Talk about the parts of clothing items and how we use them (i.e. pockets, buttons, zippers).
- Play Simon Says using directions that involve verbs, prepositions, body parts, counting, and emotions.
- Have your child label each item they use to brush their teeth. Provide models for words that contain sounds your child has difficulty producing.
- Use Communicative Temptations while drawing a rainbow. Let your child request each color.



Parents of lower elementary students,

I had an inquiry about how I bill the morning/afternoon milks that your child/ren may take throughout the week.

There is a check off sheet that each classroom teacher has to mark the number of milks that your child has for breaks, for the week. These are tallied at the end of the week and turned into the Elementary Secretary usually at the beginning of the next week. When I

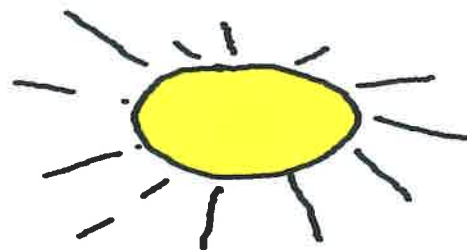
receive them in my office, I then total them and enter the weekly numbers into my program.

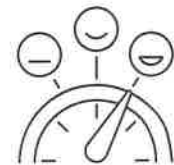

Nebraska SMART is a free virtual tutoring program for students in grades K-12. Teacher education candidates from Chadron State, Peru State, and Wayne State Colleges remotely tutor students in Educational Service Units 1, 4, and 13 through an online tutoring platform. This program is made possible by a Nebraska Department of Education grant awarded to the Nebraska State College System to launch a rural tutoring program.

Nebraska SMART's official launch date to tutor students in grades K-12 is February 5, 2024. Tutoring hours are 3:30-6:30 PM, Monday through Friday.

Parents who wish to gain access to tutoring must register their child(ren) by visiting www.nscs.edu/NebraskaSMART.

Parents must first create an account and register their child(ren). Once parents have created their account and added their child(ren), the student (or parent on their behalf) can schedule a tutoring appointment. Students can also join on-demand tutoring to be connected with the next available Tutor.

The [Parent Guide](#) provides steps for parents to register their child(ren), schedule a session, request on-demand tutoring, and more.

Students should provide homework for which they wish to receive help or topics that they would like to cover. When connected to a Tutor, students (or parents on their behalf) can share files with their Tutor. It is recommended that students (or parents on their behalf) have saved their homework to their computer prior to connecting to a Tutor.

The Nebraska SMART tutoring platform can be accessed via a laptop, desktop, or Chromebook. Please note that smartphones and some tablets are not currently supported by this platform. See below for Nebraska SMART's technology requirements.

Bed Bugs in Schools

Guidance for Parents



Bed bugs can hitchhike from different locations into homes and schools. Education and preparation are the formula for success in dealing with bed bugs. Here are things you can do as a parent to keep bed bugs out of your child's school and your home.

Prevent Bed Bugs from Coming Home

- Limit the items your child brings home from school.
- Inspect items as they arrive from school.
- Keep school items like backpacks, books, and jackets in a single area of the home that is separate from the sleeping areas. If the school has reported problems with bed bugs, isolate them in a sealed plastic container.

A school is not an ideal place for bed bugs, but it can serve as a hub for their travel to other locations, including homes.

Keep Them Out of School

- Limit the items your child takes to school.
- Because backpacks and coats are the most common way for a bed bug to get a ride to school, put them in a dryer on high heat for 30 minutes weekly.
- Store freshly laundered clothing in sealed plastic bags or boxes until they are put on if you have problems with bed bugs in your home.

If You Spot a Bed Bug

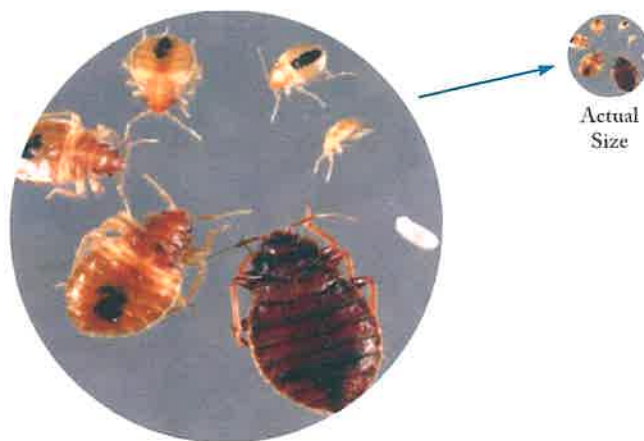
- Catch the suspected bed bug in a zip top bag or contain it under clear tape for identification.
- Many [universities](#) and pest management firms offer identification services.
- Arrange for an inspection by a pest management professional.
- Contact your school nurse so they can investigate within the school.

Bed bugs are not a sign of unhealthy living conditions. We can unknowingly bring them home from infested areas in clothes, shoes, backpacks and other items.

If You Have Bed Bugs at Home

- Put clothing, backpacks, shoes, bedding, and similar objects in a dryer at high temperature for 30 minutes.
- Vacuum bed bugs from cracks and crevices in furniture, equipment, walls, and floors.
- Eliminate clutter to reduce hiding places.
- Use a protective cover that encases mattresses and box springs and eliminates bed bug hiding spots.
- Install [bed bug interceptors](#) (devices placed under the legs of furniture to catch bed bugs and keep them from climbing the legs).
- Talk with a professional pest control company about non-chemical methods like heat treatment of rooms, furniture and other large items.
- If needed, use pesticides made specifically for bed bugs carefully according the label directions or hire a pest management professional.

How to Examine for Head Lice

Use bright light to look at:

- 1 Crown of head
- 2 Bangs
- 3 Behind both ears
- 4 Nape of neck

How to inspect

- 1 Place gloves on your hands
- 2 Use fingers to separate hair and create a part. The part should allow you to clearly see the person's scalp.
- 3 Look for lice crawling on the scalp where the hair is parted or on the hair shaft. The lice will be dark in color and the size of a poppyseed.
- 4 Look for nits near hair follicle about $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from scalp. Nits (eggs) will be white or yellowish-brown. Nits are often more easily seen than lice, especially when the person has dark hair.
- 5 Also look behind both ears and near the back of the neck. You may see lice or nits. You may also see bites.

SCREENING TIP:

To distinguish between dandruff and nits, try to flick or pull off the white speck. Dandruff is easily pulled off, but nits are not.

Change gloves between each child's examination and wash your hands after all examinations are completed.
