Fall activities are revving up with the first scheduled practices on August 10, 2020. More information will be available at the beginning of the school year.

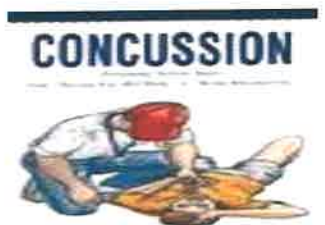
Nebraska Child Find



Child Find is a community wide effort to provide opportunities for children with disabilities. The purpose of Child Find is to identify children between birth and 21 years of age who may have individual needs that result from disabilities. The local school district works in cooperation with the medical community and other service agencies to locate children with disabilities in our area. Services are available for any eligible child including those who are home schooled. 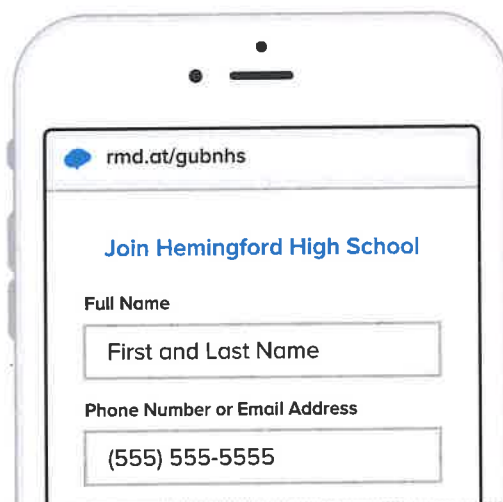
