From the Superintendent's Standpoint

Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG) Program Coming to Hemingford Public Schools

Hemingford Public Schools will be partnering with United Way of the Midlands to bring a Jobs for America's Graduates teacher to our school district. Jobs for America's Graduates has been around since the 1980s but is just getting established in Nebraska. Known as JAG-NE (for Jobs for America's Graduates - Nebraska).

In 2018, Governor Ricketts brought the program to Nebraska under the Nebraska Department of Labor. Since then, it has transitioned to operating under the United Way of the Midlands. There are currently approximately 35 schools with JAG-NE programs.

Under the program, JAG-NE works with local schools to identify and hire a person who qualifies for career preparation certification through the Nebraska Department of Education. JAG-NE pays the cost of teacher employment for the first two years. After that, the cost to the school district is \$10,000/year, with the remainder covered by JAG-NE.

The program includes a curriculum and opportunities for student leadership. The responsibilities of the school include supervision and evaluation of the teacher, scheduling, etc. (just like if the teacher was our employee), and transportation to student learning opportunities.

There has been a significant effort by Governor Pillen and businesses in our state to expand this program, and as a result of the initiative, they are starting to "wait-list" schools. That being said, our school has been approved to participate beginning in the 2024-2025 school year.

As I think about our strategic plan, a partnership with JAG-NE seems to help address a couple of our performance indicators established by the Board of Education:

1.1(b) Assess and monitor course offerings and life and career readiness programs, as well as class choice opportunities to enhance the learning opportunities for HPS students.

1.1(c) Integrate career, college, and technical training curriculum and learning experiences throughout the district.

1.3(d) Collaborate with industry and community representatives for job shadow opportunities, career pathways exploration, student internships, and teacher externships to increase awareness of career opportunities.

1.4(a) Provide mentorships, internships, and job shadowing opportunities to support career-college readiness for the secondary students.

1.4(c) Integrate relational skill building characteristics including leadership, communication, conflict resolution, respectfulness, and collaboration through life skills and career/life readiness instruction.

REARING TO READ TIPS FOR PARENTS

You Are Your Child's First Teacher

Your baby's first sounds and words were greeted with enthusiasm and delight.

You pointed out objects, sang, and talked. Baby's words became clearer, the sentences longer. It doesn't happen overnight, nor does it begin on the first day of school. It starts at home. The trick is to treat reading naturally and confidently as you treated learning to talk. Relax and enjoy this time together.

Be A Model

Show your child that reading is one of your special interests by reading often and sharing your enthusiasms with him/her.

Accessibility Is Important!

Keep toddler's books arranged so they can reach them and make them a vital part of their day. Spread a preschooler's books out on a low table or displayed on a low bookshelf so he/she can see the covers. Your child will easily bring you the book about the dump truck when asked. Recognition - discrimination - at two years old, all part of beginning reading.

Start Early. Read It Again. Be Patient.

Begin looking at books with your child from infancy. If your little one isn't trying to eat the book, you have started too late. Babies will claim their favorite pages - chicks that cheep, cows that moo, trucks that rrrroar! Develop your sound effects and expression. Enthusiasm helps hold their attention!

Repetition is key to reaching young children. Hearing the same book in the same exact way is what the toddler loves. Resist the urge to bombard your very young child with every new book. Introduce books slowly. Let them become familiar, old friends.

Choose to paraphrase the text or just talk about what is happening in the pictures. Let the child turn the pages - but suggest that he/she "look for the kitty in the window, etc." Often it's a slow beginning but in time he/she will be listening for longer and longer periods.

Make Connections!

Choose books to reflect and enhance what is happening in your child's life. Are you moving, building, planting a garden? Is your child fascinated by construction vehicles or butterflies or trains? Books will jump to prime importance when they relate to your child's interests. Be sure to include nonfiction books from an early age. They are invaluable in providing relevant information.
