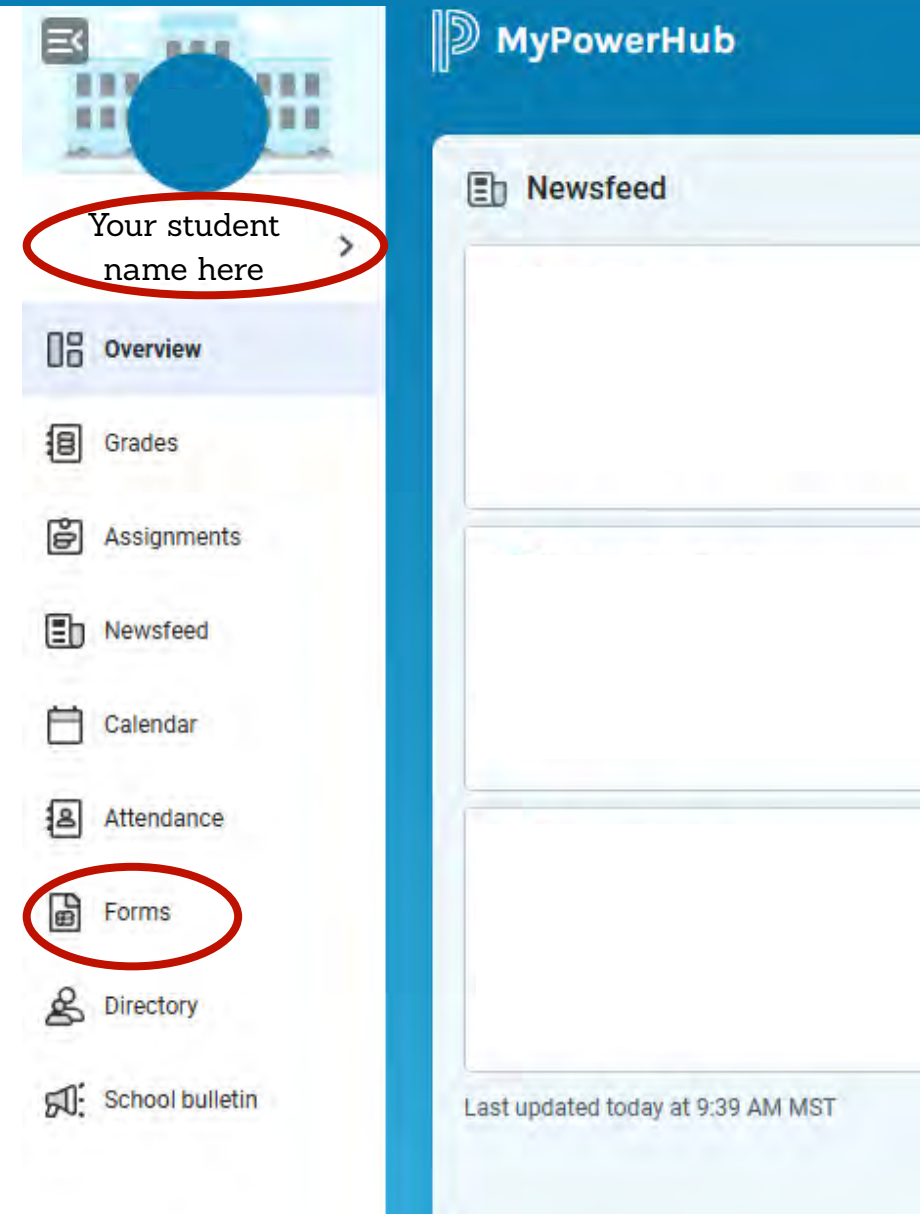

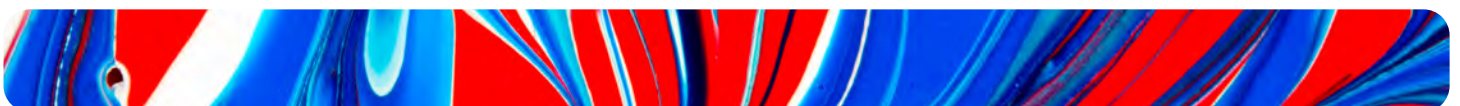

HIGH ABILITY LEARNERS

The High Ability Learners Program, HAL, is a service provided to students who consistently receive a 95% or above on national test scores in the areas of Reading, Math, or Science. Services provided may differ based on the individual student needs or motivations. All students are considered for the program at the beginning of the school year and if a new student transfers into the district. The Bobcat CARE (Community Action Reaching Education) Fund

As we begin a new school year, our character focus for August is Kindness. Kindness is one of the simplest ways we can make our school a place where everyone feels welcomed, valued, and supported.

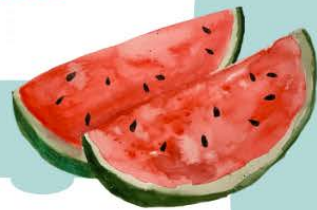
